## Meet the Author











Aisha was born in the Middle East and has lived in Kuwait, England and Canada. Aisha studied English literature and Philosophy at the University of Birmingham and works part-time as a bookseller. The first novel she worked on was a piece of Harry Potter fan fiction titled Harry Potter and the final Horcrux. She now writes children's books, sometimes with a little bit of magic in them.



Aisha's debut middle grade novel, A Pocketful of Stars, was published by Egmont in August 2019 and her second novel Moonchild: Voyage of the Lost and Found will be published in August 2020.

Scents play a significant role in A Pocketful of Stars, because the central character (protagonist) Safiya visits her mother's memories through a magical perfume bottle.



# has Challe

Your challenge is to write an opening paragraph to a novel that is inspired by olfactory stimuli (in other words using your sense of smell).

Step 1: Start by going on a scavenger hunt round your house and finding something that you believe smells interesting. It can smell good, like fruit or soap, or it can smell bad, like a stinky cheese. Once you've done that, write your paragraph of text following the steps below.

Step 2: Describe the smell in a sentence. For example, Safiya says 'The smells are wild and sweet.' you find?

> Step 3: Write another sentence but this time you can use a different sense - taste, touch, sight, or hearing. For example, Safiya describes how hot it is, 'like opening the oven door after you've baked something delicious.'


Step 4: Think about where you might be when you stumble across the smell. It could be anywhere. For example, Safiya is in a courtyard.

Then, put it all together, with a few more words in between. For example, see the paragraph below which formed part of the passage I read for you from Chapter 4 of 'A Pocketful of Stars':




